## IN APPRECIATION

Some years ago the author's son, Jack Lord, and a nephew, Jake Hunter (Bob) Bergman, expressed separately the wish that the author would write his recollections of the family from his grandparents down to recent times. This was begun with the thought that it would be limited mainly to recollections, but it soon seemed desirable to fill in with data that only research could provide, so it became more and more a research project, and a very interesting one. It is regretted that a more extensive and thorough research could not have been done.

The author has not undertaken a complete genealogy of the Lords and Foglemans, but rather a narrative account of the families of Greenberry W.--Martha Chambers Lord, Elijah L. (Lige)--Irene Montgomery Fogleman and Dock C.--Ella Fogleman Lord. The ancestry of the Lords, Chambers, Foglemans and Montgomerys is given as far as the author under the circumstances has been able to ascertain. The descendants of Greenberry and Martha Lord and of Lige and Irene Fogleman are carried only down to their grandchildren, except those in the Dock--Ella Lord line, who are listed down to the great-grandchildren. Primarily of interest to the author's immediate family is a final chapter on the Clyde W.--Grace Stark Lord family, which is omitted from most of the copies of the history.

Advanced in age and limited in resources as the author has been, it would have been impossible to write this family history without the generous assistance of cousins, brothers, sisters, and others who contributed recollections, family data, research or references. Some of the research has supplied data so vital and timely as to be regarded as providential. Without the research of Guy Fogleman, a teen-age great-great-grandson of Lige Fogleman, together with that of his mother, Mrs. Carroll Fogleman, and others of their family, the author could not have gotten the Fogleman ancestry nor many of the members and relationships of the family. Likewise, David B. Lord, who has done extensive and intensive research on the Lords, carried the lineage of his--our--branch of the family back to the colonial period and linked it with the English Lords. Records of Wilkinson County, Georgia, published by Victor Davidson and Joseph T. Maddox, definitely place Greenberry Lord and others in this line of the family and also provide material on the Chambers family. Virginia (Virgie) Collier Speights, a Chambers descendant, has done research on the ancestry of that family, and she and her husband, Drayton B. Speights, have also given the author records and much other assistance on the Chambers and Lord families in Sabine County, Texas. They located the places in the area of settlement, and Peggy Frantis Caldwell did the map work. Belva Vickers Beall generously researched the Bethel (New Hope) Church records for the Lord and Fogleman relationships with that church. The author is greatly indebted to Corene Tyler Todd for numerous land and marriage records and other information on the Lords and Chamberses.

Cousins who have contributed by correspondence or interview include Alice Lord Greenlee, Kathryn Lord Wise, Ethel Lord Eckert, Lula Lord Crowell, Ivy Lord, Ola Bragg Watson, Clifford J. Watson, Lela Miller Boles, Martha Gomer Harvill, Ira Chambers, Nannie Chambers Grim, Willie Lee Grim Taylor, Lois Fogleman Gordon, Ernest, Floyd, Lester, Scarbrough and Willie K. Fogleman, Cecil Shuff and Willie Mae Wilson Weaver. Alice Greenlee, Ethel Eckert and Kathryn Wise filled in significant detail on George and Henry Lord, Lois Gordon and Ernest Fogleman did this more fully on Lige and Louis Fogleman, and Scarbrough Fogleman transmitted the data on John Fogleman's career, largely from the remarkable memory of Allie Keller Fogleman, who had also given the author other memories of the Foglemans. Members of the author's family have helped, Irene Lord with her recollections, Roberta Lord Bergman and Corinne Lord Bedell with certain events, and all the brothers and sisters, including Lurline Davis Lord (on behalf of her husband), have supplied the data for the sketch of their own lives. Likewise, the author's wife and children have contributed to the accounts of their own careers.
